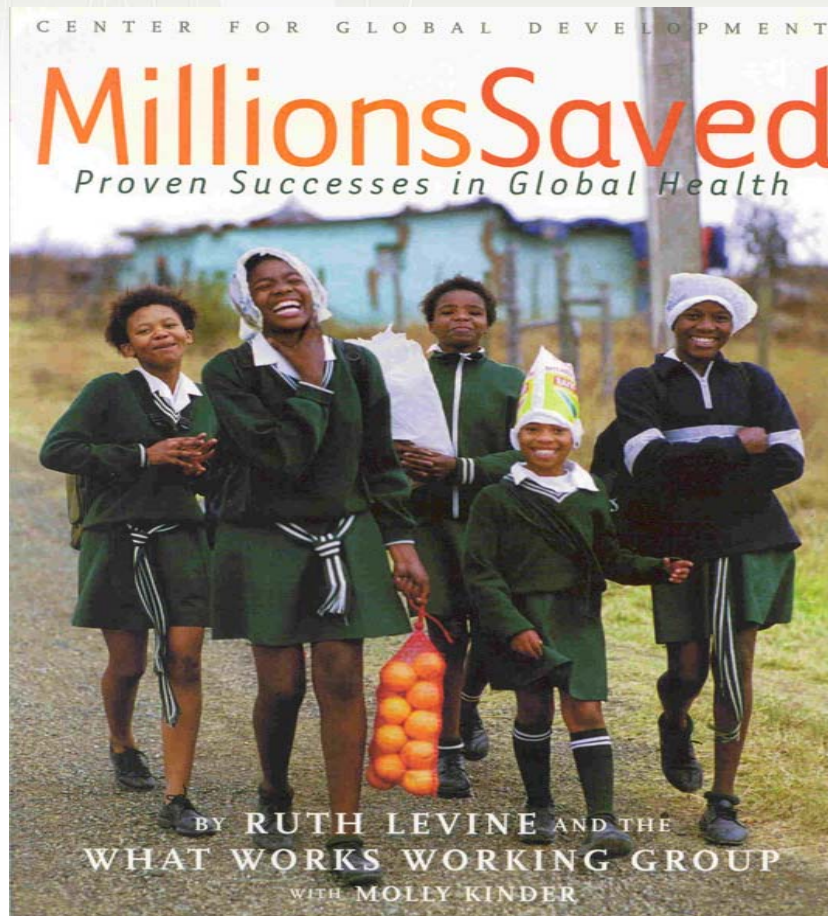

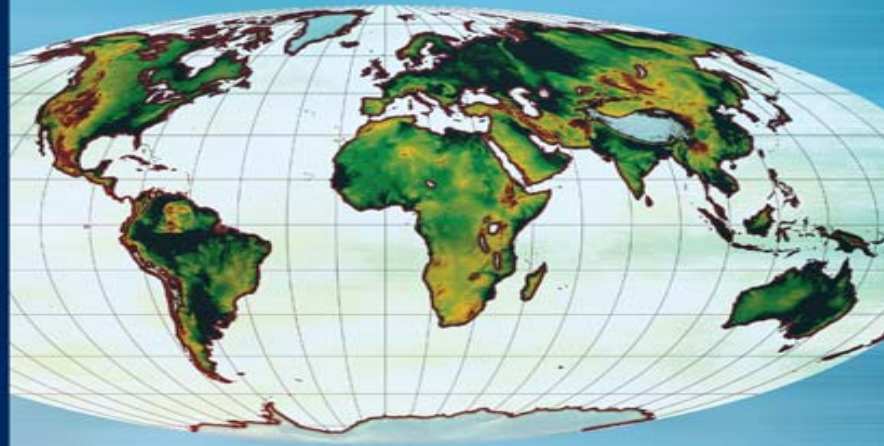

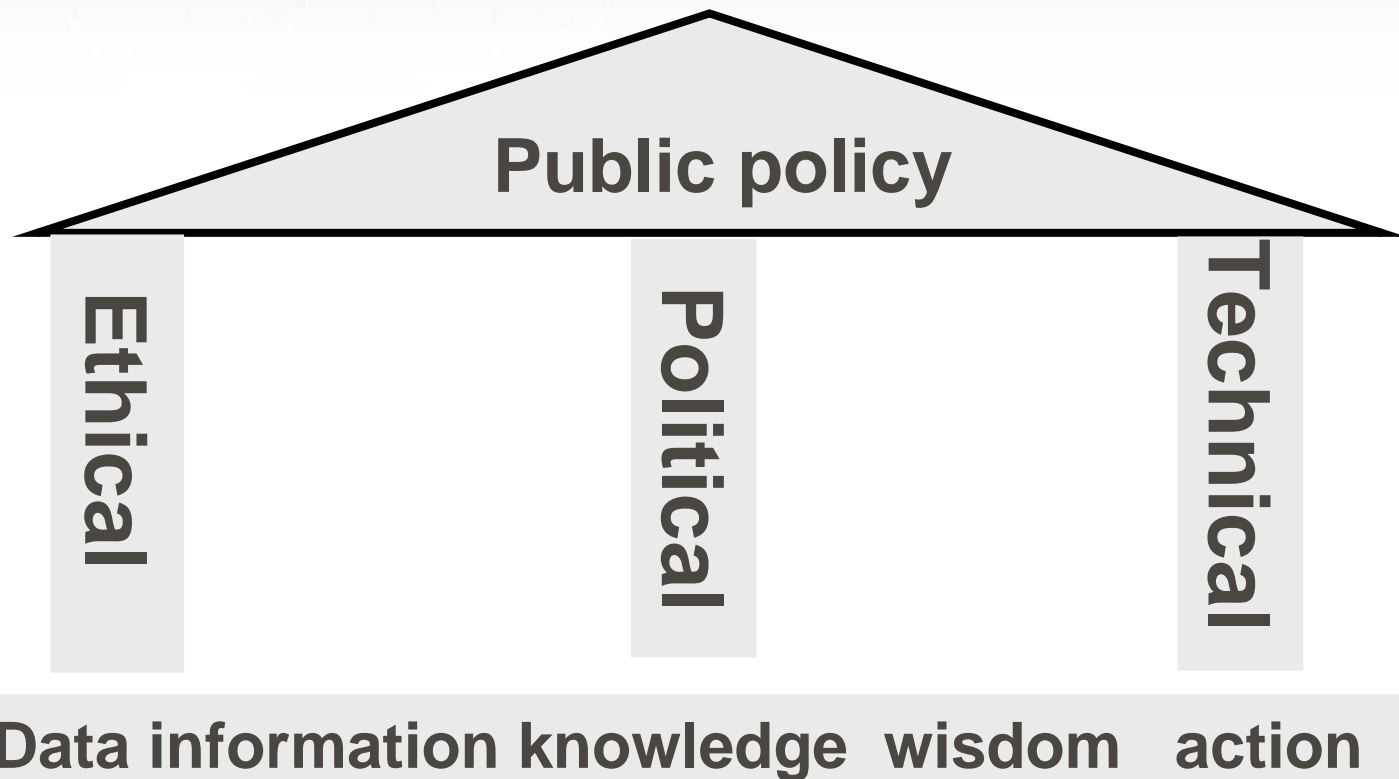
Main Thesis of DCPP

The generation and diffusion of new information and products underpinned the enormous improvements in health of the 20th century. There is every reason to believe that continued progress—meeting the challenges of non-communicable disease, HIV/AIDS, potential pandemics, health inequities and neglected populations—will continue to rely heavily on new information.

Sources and pillars of public policy



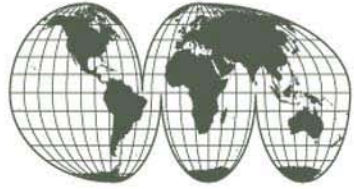
Role of DCP

Provide the evidence on

- Epidemiology
- Burden of disease
- Cost effectiveness of interventions
- System deficiencies
- Research gaps

Communicate major findings

- Suggesting the **“best buys”** and the **“worst buys”** for the conditions under consideration
- Disseminating the results widely to multiple audiences, particularly the scientific community and policy makers at all levels
- Stimulating national priority setting and program implementation
